

Session 10: Christlike Behaviour part 1

(First Pause)

Answer the following questions:

When you hear the phrase “Christlike character,” what comes to mind?

Why do you think Christians often focus more on outward behaviours than inward transformation?

(Second Pause)

Read Galatians 5:16–25:

Why does it matter that Paul calls it “fruit,” not “fruits”? What is the difference between natural niceness and Spirit-produced character?

Which aspects of the fruit come most naturally to you? Which feel most “unnatural” for you?

(Third Pause)

Read Ezekiel 36:26–27, John 15:1-17 and Romans 7:14-25

Where do you see the weakness of the flesh in your daily life?

What does it practically mean to abide in Christ? How does this union with Christ give you confidence in your spiritual growth?

If each fruit of the Spirit is love taking a different form, which expression of love do you most need to grow in right now, and what might that look like in your daily life?

How does each part reflect the character of Jesus?

The Fruit of the Spirit

LOVE	JOY	PEACE
Self-giving, self-sacrificing affection	Delight in God regardless of circumstance (Love Dancing)	Settled confidence in God's care (Love Resting)
PATIENCE	KINDNESS	GOODNESS
Endurance without resentment (Love Waiting)	Graciousness flowing from God's kindness (Love Doing)	Moral integrity and purity (Love Producing)
FAITHFULNESS	GENTLENESS	SELF-CONTROL
Reliability grounded in God's faithfulness (Love Unrelenting)	Strength under control (Love Caring)	Spirit-empowered mastery over desires (Love Deliberately Choosing)
