Do you agree with this definition of Salvation? Why/why not?

*Man needs to be saved from **The Flesh** Romans 7:7-14*

*Man needs to be saved from **God's Wrath** John 3:36, Romans 1:18*

*Man needs to be saved from **The Law** Romans 3:19-20, Romans 4:15*

*Man needs to be saved from **Death/Judgement/Hell** Luke 16:19-31, Revelation 20:11-15*

Read John 10:10 and Romans 12:2 and answer the following question:

What is man saved for?

To have life and have it abundantly – our good – and to be transformed for the better



Abundant life and a meaningful existence can only be found in the Lord Jesus Christ. One without Christ will never know what God's will was for his or her life. They will never know the real purpose of their existence. Therefore, believe upon the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved."
